Crossing Guard

Basic Function

Under the direction of the Transportation Supervisor, escort school children safely across designated street intersections; assist in directing traffic to and from school grounds.

Representative Duties

Escort children across street at designated locations; utilize due caution and display crossing sign. E

Assist in directing traffic to and from school grounds. E

Prevent children from crossing street during the flow of traffic until it is safe to cross. E

Report, to the Principal as soon as possible, license numbers of cars failing to stop for children when signaled to do so, exhibiting unusual, unsafe, dangerous or improper conduct. E

Answer questions regarding street and school locations. E

Obtain names of children who repeatedly refuse to obey crossing guard's instructions and report names to Principal. E

Notify police, school authorities and ambulance in case of injuries or accidents at designated crossing. E Oversee playground activities as assigned.
